The summer show by students in the art department is on display in the Josephine Long Wishart Museum of Art.

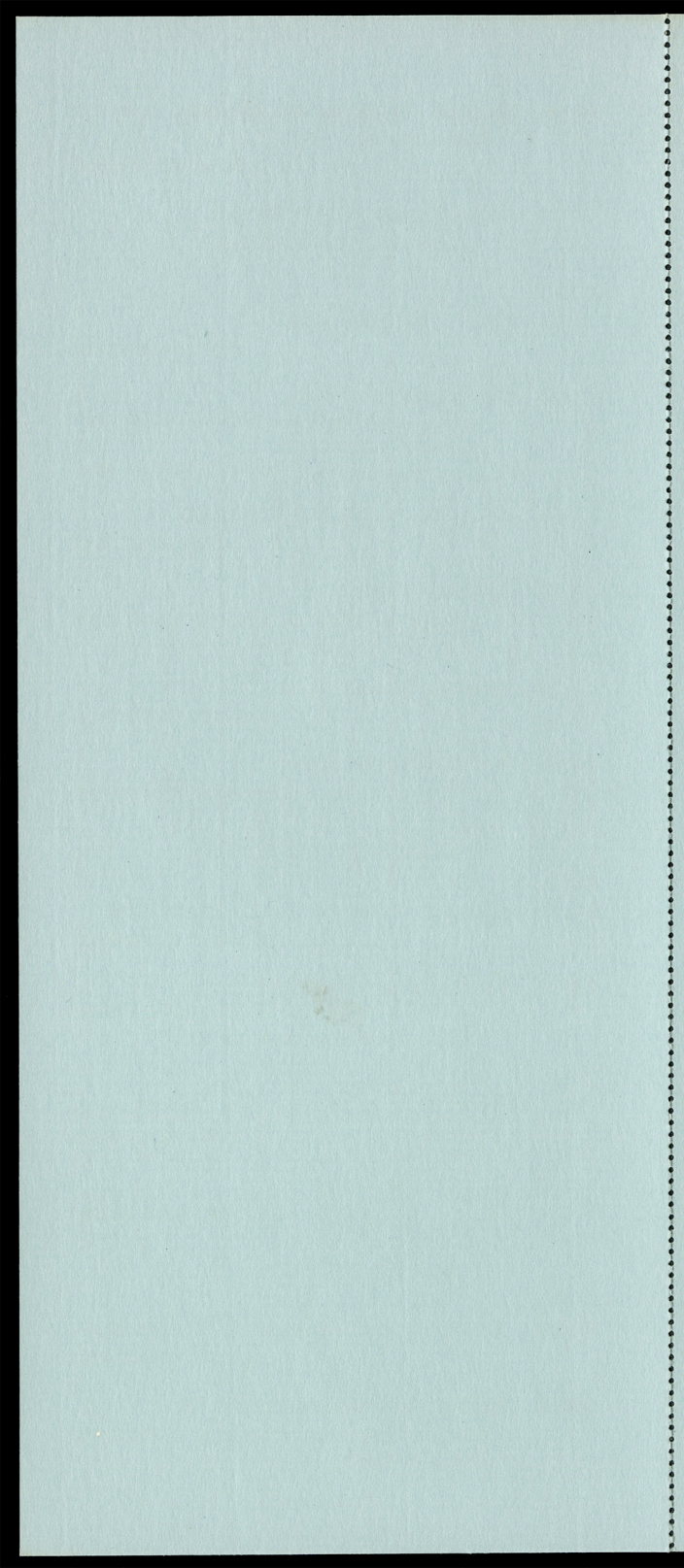
