- ALUMNI & COMMUNITY COLLEGE: There will be three lectures on Friday in Mateer Hall, open to the public without charge. (See other side.) All alumni, parents, and students are cordially invited to attend. There will be a coffee break at 10:30 a.m.
- STUDENT SUMMER ART EXHIBITION: Annual selection of student work from classes in painting, ceramics and sculpture, drawing and printmaking. Art Center (Frick Library) University Street.
- COFFEE BAR: Free coffee, punch, and cookies will be served all day Friday and Saturday in the main lounge of Lowry Center.
- MAIL: May be called for at Alumni Headquarters in lobby of Lowry Center.
- COLLEGE BOOKSTORE: Monday through Saturday, the College Bookstore, located on the main floor of Lowry Center, will be open from 8:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. On Sunday, June 14, the Bookstore will be open from 1:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. Mr. Don Noll, Manager of the Bookstore, will hold Open House on Friday, June 12, from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. Coffee and cookies will be served. Browsers are welcome.
- SCOT LANES: Will be open for bowling and pocket billiards. There will be a prize for the high games bowled for both men and women. A prize for pocket billiards will be offered for the most balls run during one turn.

MEALS: All alumni, parents, and their guests are invited to use the Lowry Center Dining Room for all meals, which are cafeteria style. Space has been provided on the reservation form for indicating which meals will be taken in Lowry Center. This enables Food Service to have some idea of how many to prepare for. Please do not send money for any meals except the Saturday Alumni Luncheon with this reservation form.

ALL-ALUMNI LUNCHEON: 12 Noon on Saturday, June 13, in the air-conditioned Lowry Center Dining Room. Payment in advance for this luncheon must accompany reservation form in order to guarantee a place. The meal is \$3.00 per person. Members of the Senior Class and the Class of 1920, the 50 year class, are guests of the Alumni Association and do not have to pay for this luncheon. (This includes spouses.)

MOM'S TRUCK STOP: Located on the lower floor of Lowry Center. This is a snack bar where light meals may be purchased throughout the day from 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 a.m. on week days, and on Sunday from 1:00 p.m. until 11:30 p.m. No reservations are needed.
