Dear President Copeland,

Campus Council has discussed several times the need for an increase in the student activities fee. Since the last increase of one dollar in 1979, (\$35.00 to \$36.00), many factors have arisen necessitating a further increase in this amount.


During this period Council has chartered ten new student organizations bringing the total to 26. This has meant that because of an increased number of requests for funding, we have often had to make substantial cuts in many of the requests.

The other major factor is inflation. In the past two years transportation costs have more than doubled. Quite a few of the chartered organizations depend, in one way or another, on the use of transportation. As a result, the costs of many of these programs and services has become inhibitive.

The general fact that everything costs quite a bit more than it did two years ago has manifested itself in the increased frustration of student leaders. These students attempt to maintain the quality level of their programs and services yet find that their money has less and less buying power. Unless additional funds are available a decrease in these quality levels will surely become evident.

For these reasons, I am now requesting that an increase be made in the student activities fee from \$36.00 to \$38.00. Campus Council feels that this two dollar increase is well warranted and would be in the best interests of the College.
