Proposed revisions to The Scot's Key Code of Social Responsibility:

Section III. A. 1.

1PR S S 1906

From: "The statutes prohibit consumption of alcoholic beverages by persons under 19 years of age and permit drinking only beer by persons between 19 and 21."

To: "The statutes prohibit consumption of alcoholic beverages by persons under 21 years of age with the exception that individuals who were 19 years old on or before July 31, 1987 may consume beer only."

Section III. A. 3. a. 1)

From: "Residential units may sponsor an all-campus event with beer in the unit if..."

To: "An all-campus event with beer may be sponsored by residential units or other recognized campus organizations in designated social lounges. A social event may be held if..."

Section III. A. 3. a. 3)

From: "Weekday (Sunday dinner through Friday lunch) social events in residence halls involving alcohol and/or loud music should not be planned."

To: "Residents of small house units may sponsor invitation only events with beer in the unit. The number of non-house residents in attendance will be based on house size and available lounge space. This event may be held if there is no monetary charge to the participants, if it is approved by the Director and a Dean, and if those served are of legal age according to Ohio State Law."

Section III. A. 3. a. 4)

Addition: "Weekday (Sunday dinner through Friday lunch) social events in residence halls involving alcohol and/or loud music should not be planned."
