Food Around Wooster

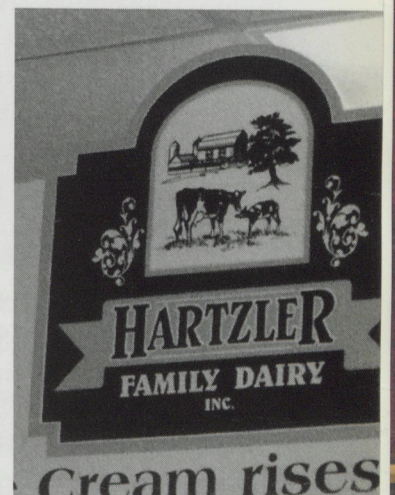
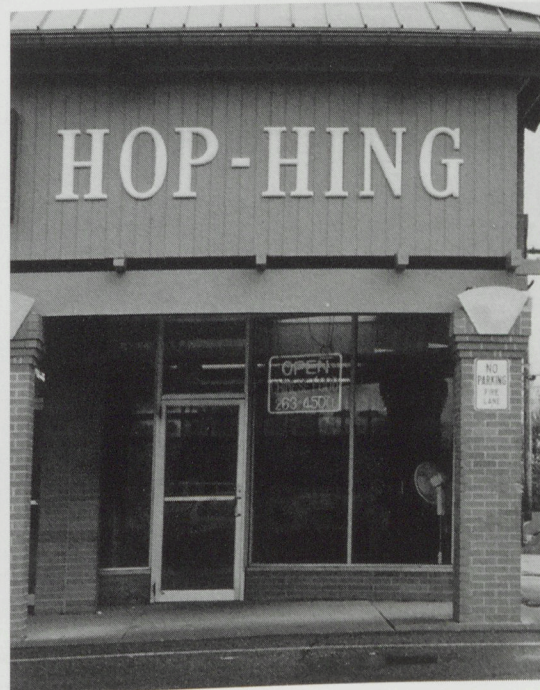
College is not known for the wonderful cuisine served at the Campus refectory. On the majority of college campuses if you ask a student if the school food was good you would most likely get the same response "Are you nuts?" As much as we all want to deny that Lowry has decent food you have to give the Dining Services credit for the changes they made. Kitterage's No Fry Zone is a huge success. The lines may be long but the food is worth the wait. However, neither Lowry or Kitterage can quench a burning craving for Taco Bell, Fazoli's, Hop Hing, or any other fast food haven in Wooster. Dinning out in Wooster may require a slight wait but it is usually worth it. Whether you are making a quick trip to Burger King or having a night out at the Olde Jaol the range of repas in Wooster is incredible. North of town the franchised establishments draw a large student population. Applebee's and Tumbleweed's have a nice upbeat atmosphere, reasonable price, and a broad menu base. Now if you have a hankering for Italian and don't have a lot of time Fazoli's has an extensive menu and a continuous supply of bread sticks (if you choose to eat in.) A bit closer to campus the food tends to get a little cheaper. All of us will have visited Taco Bell or Burger King in our four years of being at COW. With a 98 cent burrito who can not afford to make a run for the border? Although Taco Bell is open till at least 1 am, some times you just have to have a whopper. Nothing can beat that flame broiled taste. Or are you in the mood for something a little different? Hop Hing is only across the way, Chinese to go and close to home. If you prefer to sit down and relax while enjoying a meal, Wooster has plenty of food finds waiting for you. Coccia House has incredible pizza and Italian dishes. Maybe you would like a more downtown location for dinner? Wise Guys on Market St. is a nice family restaurant the serves HUGE portions of everything on the menu. Be prepared to be stuffed. Matsos Family restaurant specializes in Greek food that will keep you coming back for more. The spaghetti pizza come highly recommended. So you rather eat in style? Try the Olde Jaol. 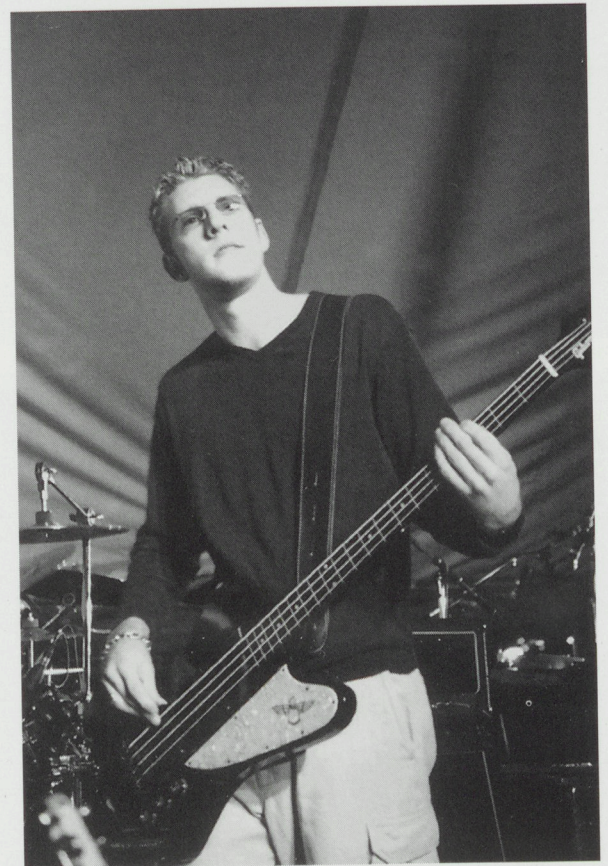

Party on the Green



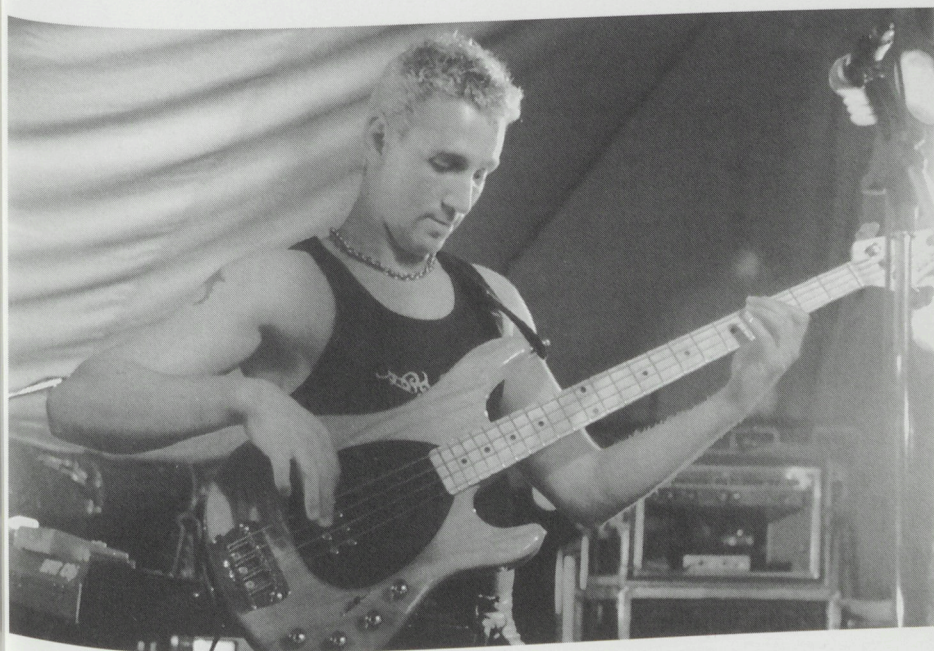
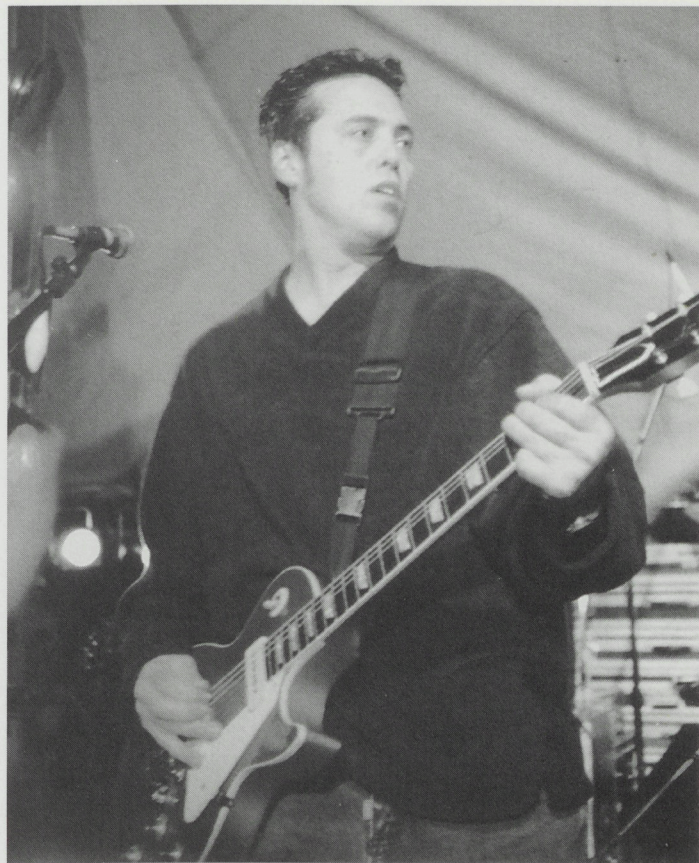

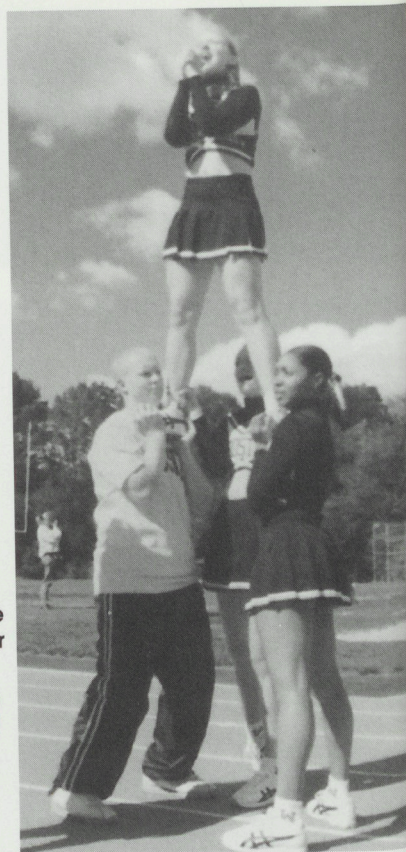

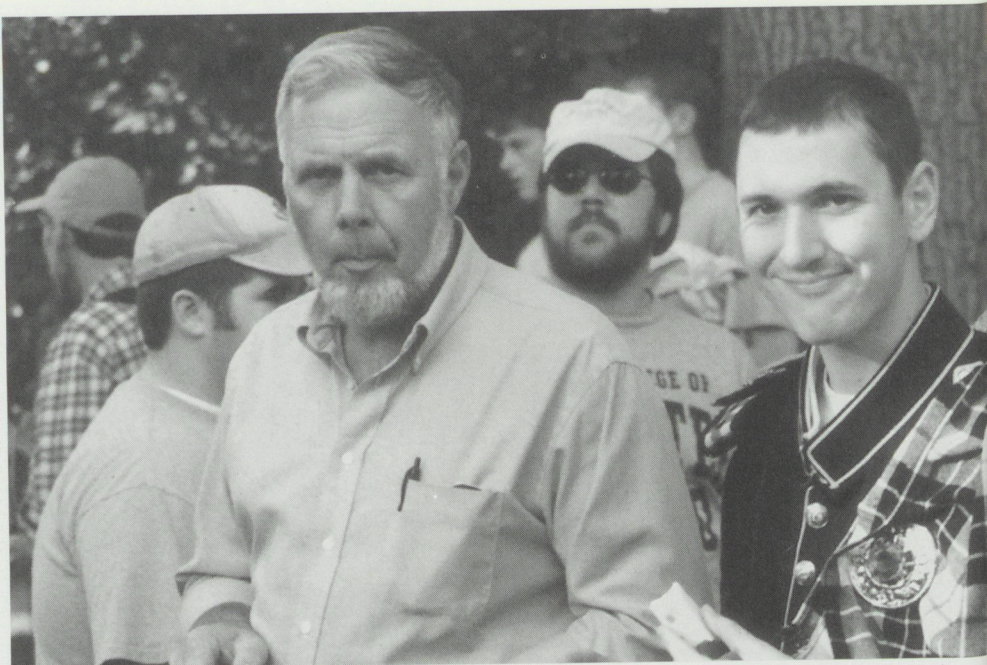

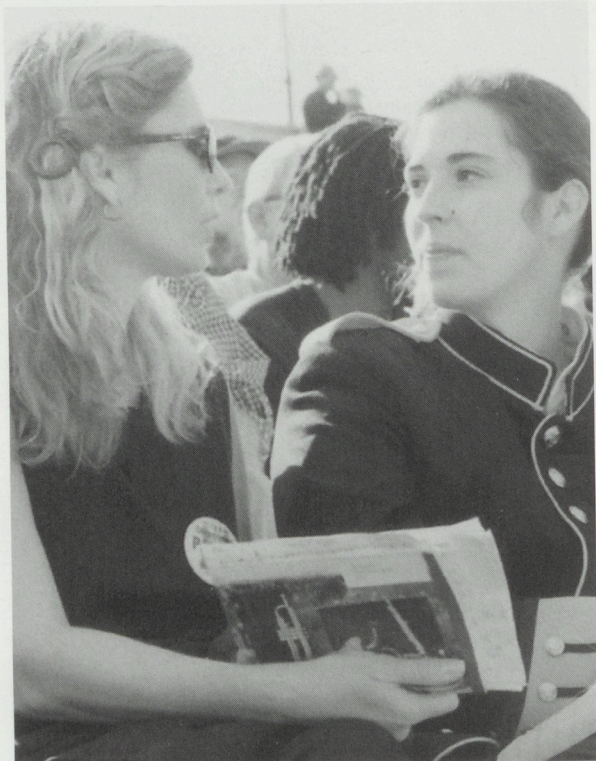

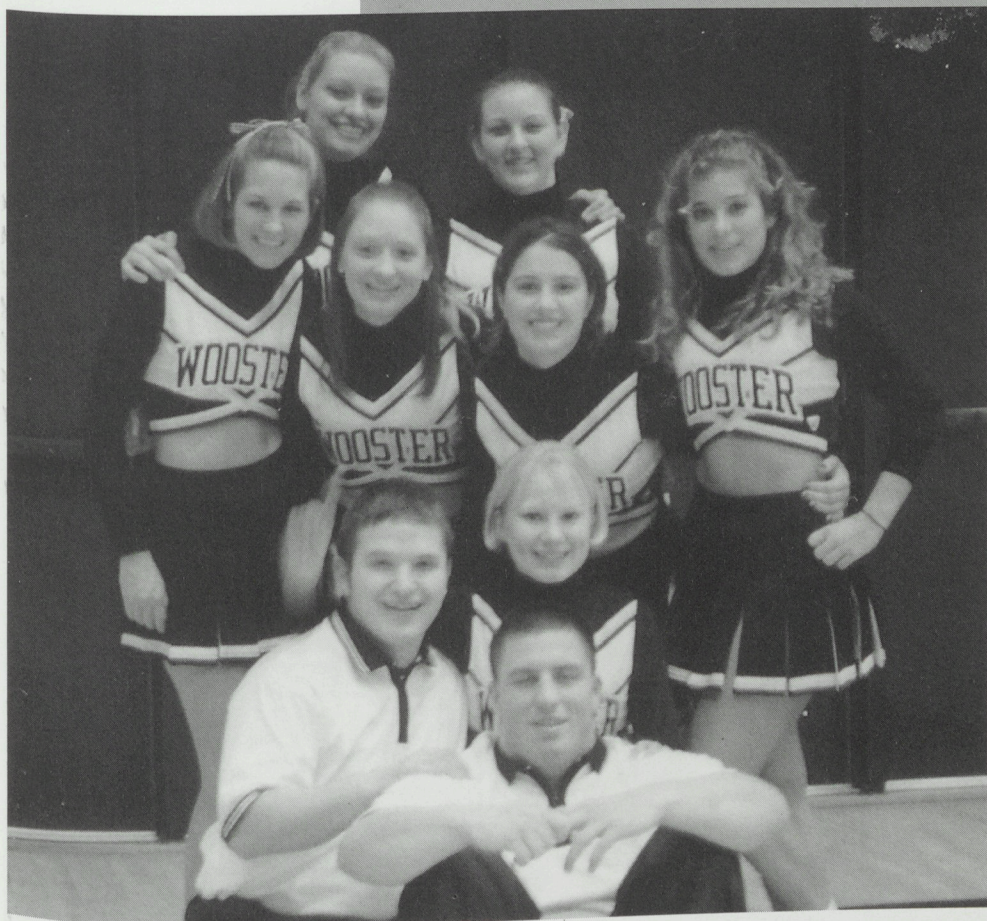

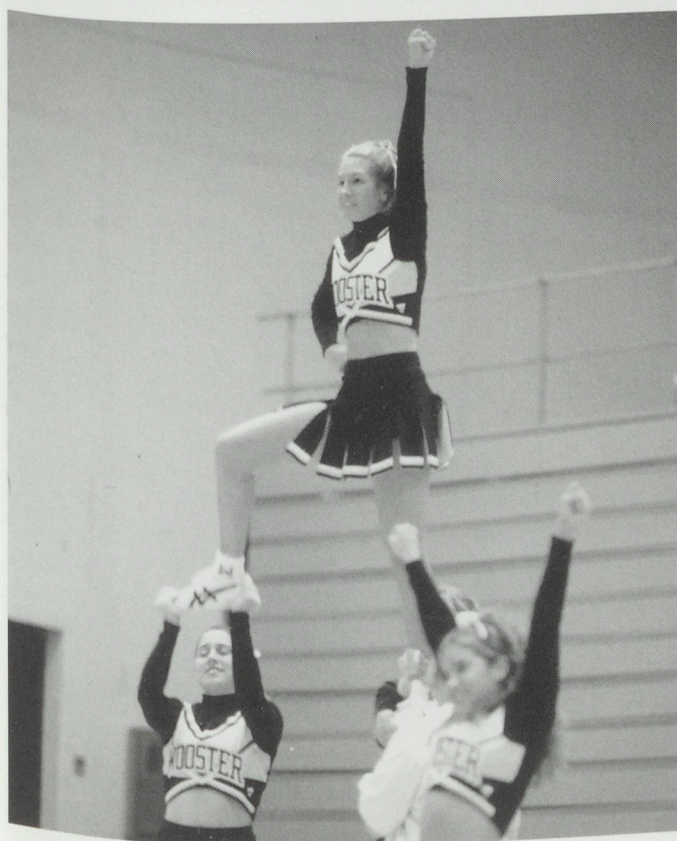

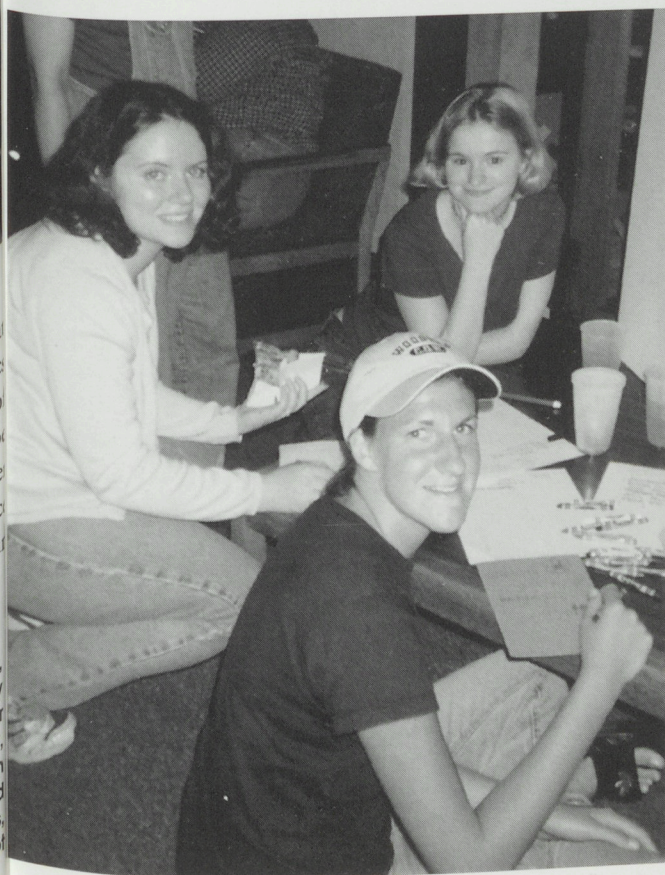

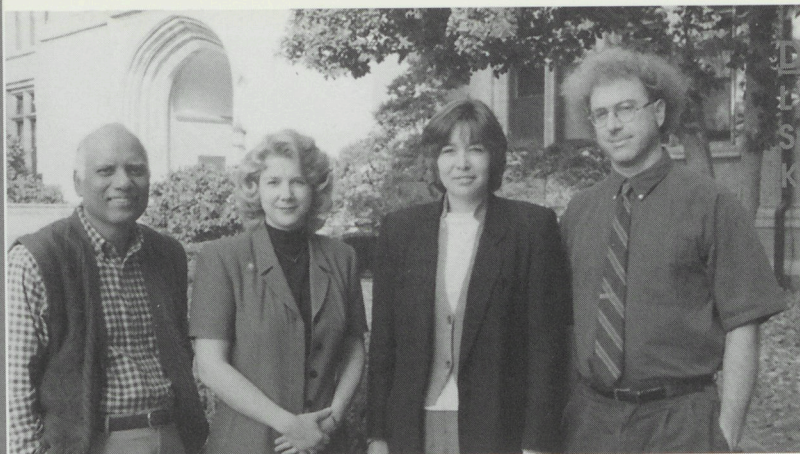

The young Scots Women's Soccer team finished off the 1999 season with a 13-4-2 overall record (4-3-1 NCAC), which tied them for fourth in the North Coast Athletic Conference. A year later, they hope to continue their charge to the top. However, the sudden loss of teammate Christine Hulke, twin sister of Stephanie, put a new spin on things.

"Everything we did this season we did for Christine," said Gina Seranni. Although they were strong in spirit and will, the ladies did not do as well as they had hoped. Led by tri-captains Heather Penny, Talley Clyde, and Sara Austin, the team finished with a disappointing 10-7 overall record (4-4 NCAC) and once again found themselves in a tie for fourth in the conference.

Individually, Beth Hemminger racked up the points with 10 goals and 2 assists on the season, followed by Emily Cole with 5 goals and 2 assists. In goal, Nicole Roman and Adrienne Walts split the time evenly to average 1.27 and 0.84 goals against the Scots per game, respectively. The backfield line of Nicole DeSantis, Lindsay Zella, Becca Stinson, and Janette Frederick, with a midfield anchor of Sara Austin, only permitted 18 goals on the season.

Led by senior captains Nick Chiorian and Matt Schneider, the men's team had an outstanding season, including a first place finish at the GLCA Championships and a third place finish at the NCAC Championships, where four runners (Chiorian, Brendan Callahan, Marty Coppola, and Evan McDaniel) placed in the top twenty individual finishers to garner All-Conference honors.

Under the leadership of seniors Sandy Tecklenburg, Rachel Dawson, and Andrea Jorjorian, the women's team improved with each consecutive meet and wrapped up the local part of the season with a fourth place finish at the NCAC Championships. Both Tecklenburg and Dawson earned All-Conference honors with second and eleventh place finishes, respectively.

With such great finishes in the NCAC, both teams were invited to participate in the Regional Championships on Nov. 11th, where the top three teams automatically qualify for the National Championships. Both teams competed well and sent one runner each to Spokane, WA. Tecklenburg and Coppola represented the Scots with 83rd and 88nd place finishes respectively.

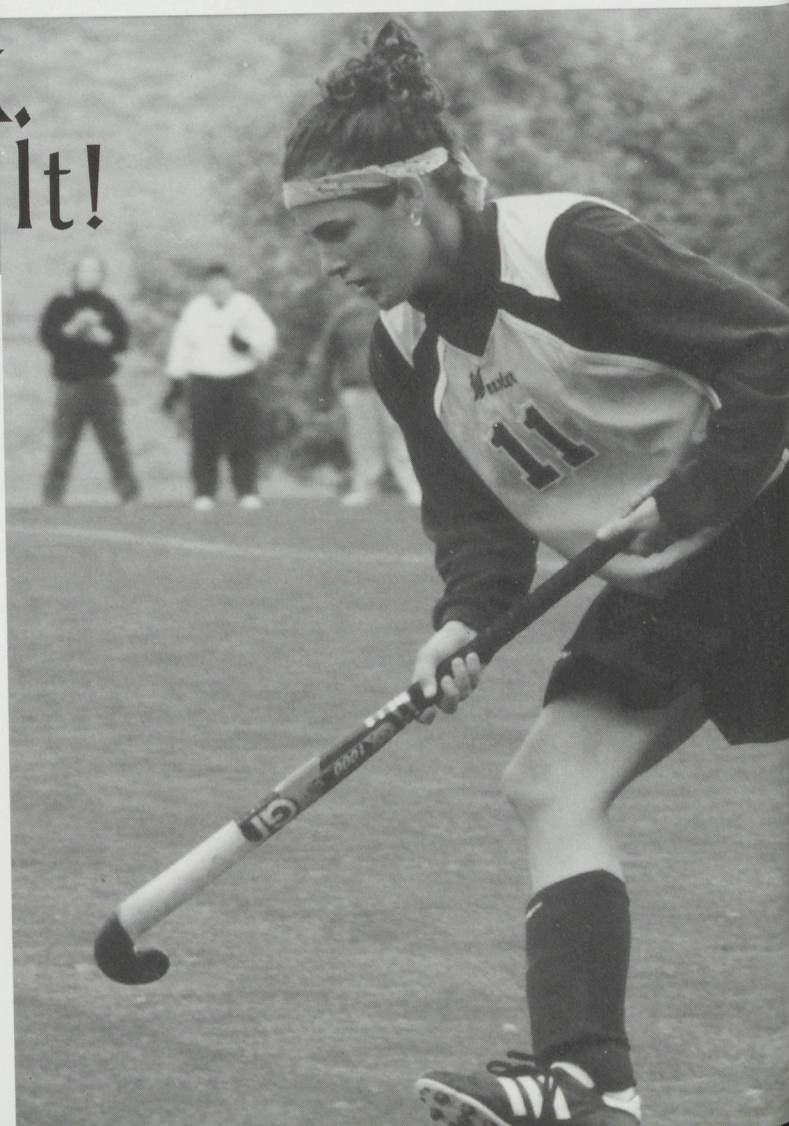


Stick. It!

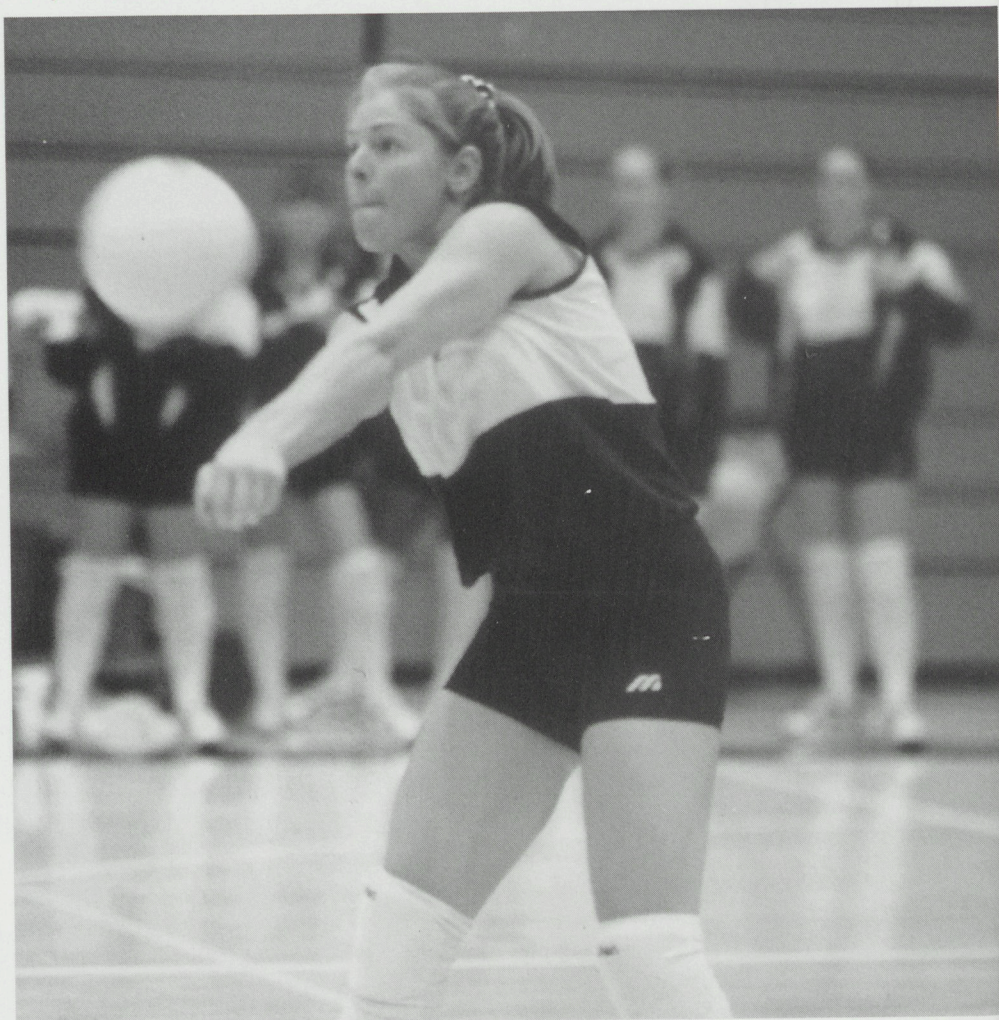
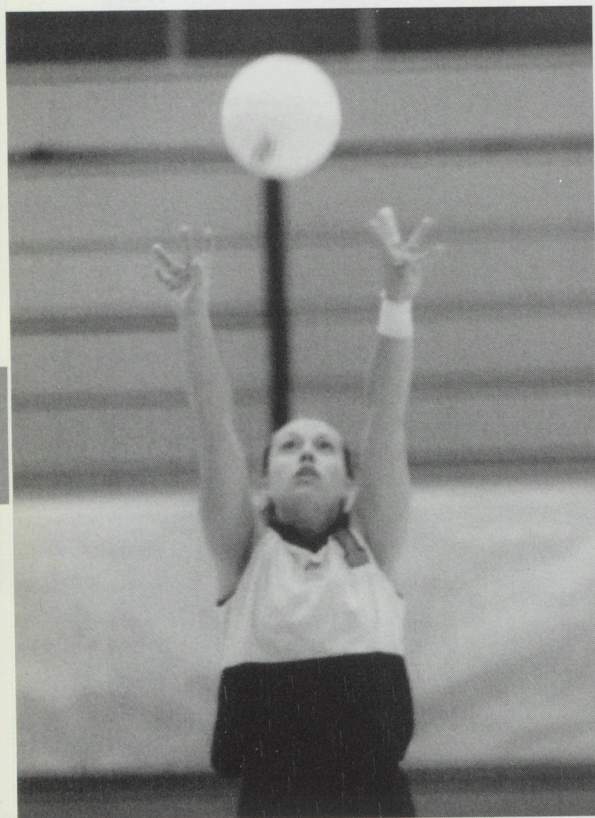

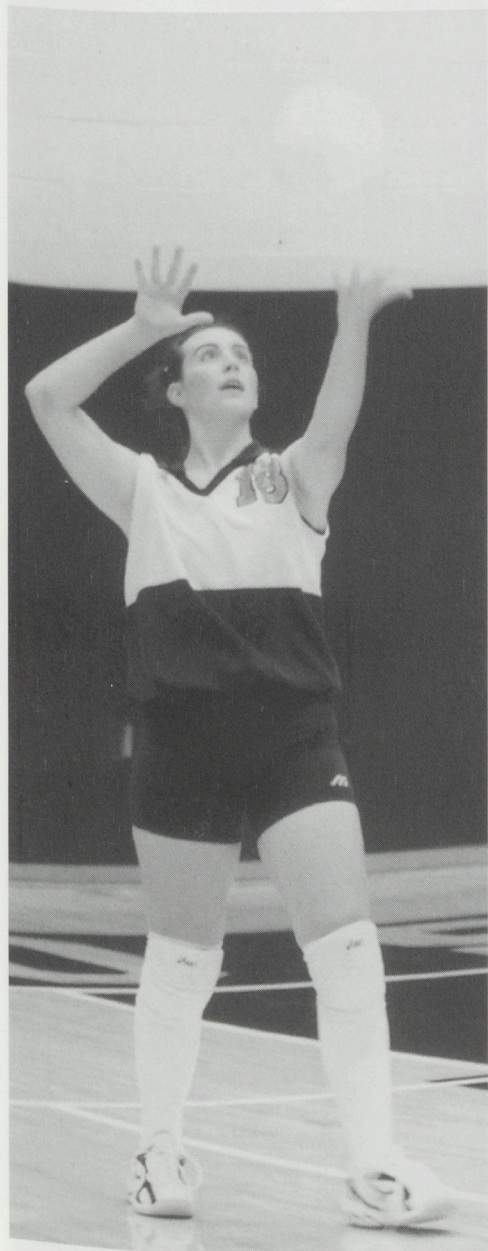
Women's Volleyball

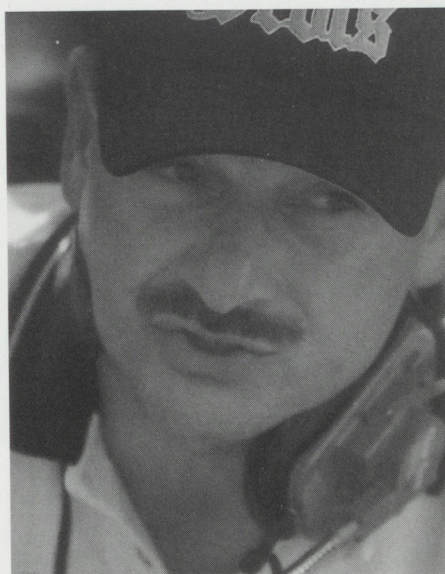

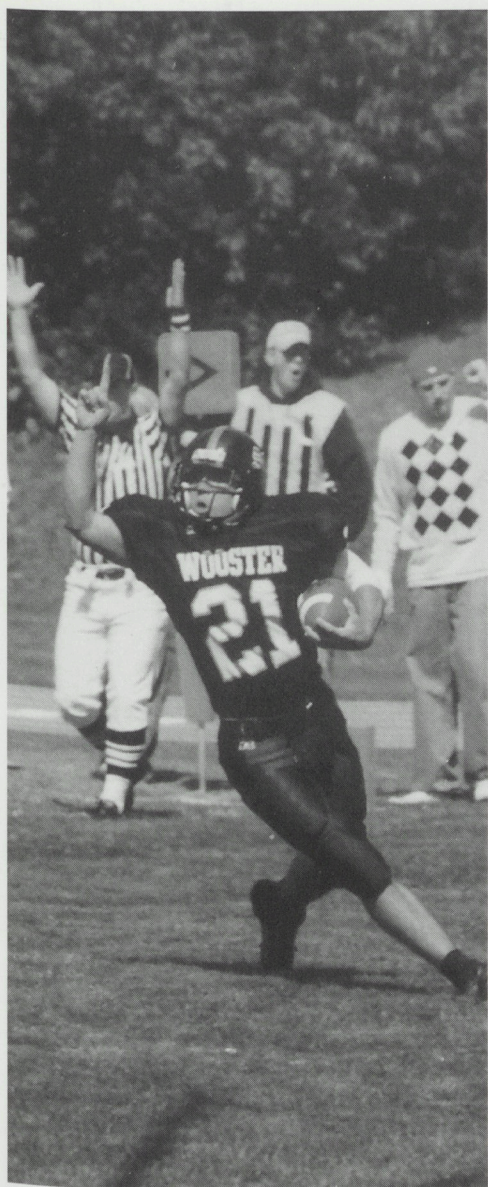
Swarm It!

Amanda: And I had to do the Greek pages the same way?

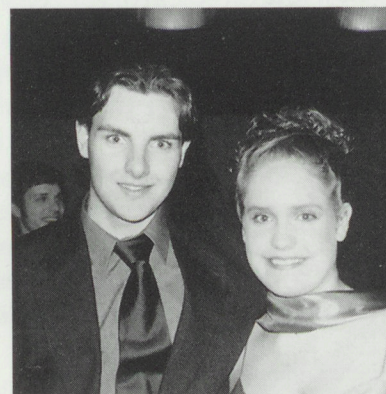
Georgia: Yeah those were fun deadlines. But we sure did an awesome job!

Georgia: And for a girl who did not have too many layout skills, she did a spectacular job!

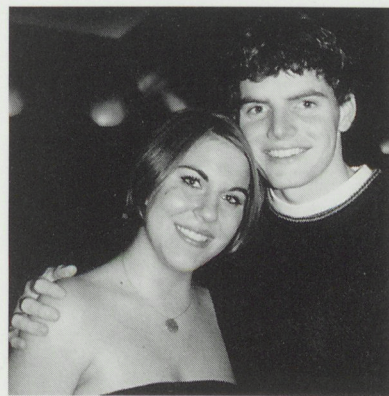
Amanda: She added some of that much needed silliness to our little office.
